Greenwich Township Adopts Open Space and Recreation Plan

On June 13th 2011, the Greenwich Township Planning Board adopted an Open Space and Recreation Plan (OSRP) as an element of the Township's Master Plan.

The OSRP is a culmination of a 13-month project undertaken by the Open Space Committee and Agricultural Board with representation from the Environmental Commission, Historical Society and Recreation Commission. Input from the residents was provided at a public visioning session in November 2010; residents also reviewed the plan recommendations and provided feedback at the Planning Board public hearing in June 2011.

The adopted plan outlines a plan for prioritizing initiatives for the development of active and passive recreation facilities as well as acquisition of open space and the stewardship and protection of natural resources as funding becomes available.

Consulting on the project were the professional firms of Clarke Caton Hintz and Finelli Consulting Engineers, Inc. Funding for this project was financed from the Township's Open Space Trust Fund coupled with a matching grant provided by the Association of New Jersey Environmental Commission (ANJEC).
