Governor's Office Updates:

For your awareness please see below details of **Governor Murphy's announcement (3-16):** To slow the spread of [#COVID19](#), I'm ordering:

- Closure of ALL pre-K, K-12 schools, colleges, and universities beginning 3/18

- Closure of ALL casinos, racetracks, theaters, gyms
- Closure of ALL non-essential retail, recreational, & entertainment businesses after 8:00 PM
- Banning gatherings of 50+

All bars and restaurants are closed for eat-in services effective 8:00 PM tonight. After 8:00 PM, these establishments may open for takeout and delivery services ONLY, until further notice.

These restrictions exist during daytime hours.

Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC):

All New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission agencies, road testing, and inspection facilities will be closed effective immediately as a measure to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. We anticipate re-opening in two weeks, on Monday, March 30, 2020.

All driver licenses, non-driver IDs, vehicle registrations, and inspection stickers expiring before May 31 have been extended by two months. Most renewals, replacements, changes of address, and other transactions can be processed online at [NJMVC.gov](https://www.njmvc.gov).
